Making an Impact

Transformative Ministries at Work

Deepening Our Connection with Read

Our church family has contributed in many ways to our friends next door at **Read Elementary School.** We have collected school supplies, snow pants and boots, snacks, and socks and we've provided a tasty lunch for the staff. These gifts have been essential to the well-being of the kids.

The most profound way that we can make an impact on the students though is through face-to-face interaction.

- ⇒ Our annual back-to-school party in the church yard shows our love through our smiles and gift of presence.
- ⇒ The Fun + One outreach provided a fun, stable, caring atmosphere in the church building on staff development days when kids didn't have school.

Many of the students in the school population have real struggles; an incarcerated parent, an absent parent, an unstable housing situation, emotional or learning challenges. *We have the power to make a positive influence* on these kids with our attention and kindness. One way is to become a mentor, **and it's much simpler than you may think.**

- ⇒ The staff identifies children who could use a positive influence in their lives and pairs them with mentors.
- ⇒ Mentors meet with their students once a week for 20 minutes, usually during their lunch period.
- ⇒ You may play a card game, color a picture, or read a book together. Or you can just sit and chat.

If there is a conflict with your schedule and you can't meet, you just notify the school. Lisa-Marie has been a mentor for four years and would be happy to tell you more about her experience. The school would like to have mentors begin in November. There are additional ways that you may help out at the school as well.

What's Up In Worship

November is the final month of our Christian year. Not only are we preparing for the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, as the body of Christ, we are preparing for the celebration of the creation of the Beloved Community Sunday. (Christ the King/Reign of Christ Sunday) Before we get to that, however, we have some additional celebrations.

will have the opportunity to ask questions that will help them prepare for their competition later this month.




FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Lego League Challenge is an engaging, hands-on STEM program

designed for students in grades 4-8. It helps young learners explore the excitement of science and technology while fostering self-confidence, critical thinking, and essential life and career skills. Through real-world engineering challenges, participants design and build LEGO robots to complete tasks on dynamic playing fields. This global robotics program inspires students to experiment, problem-solve, and develop coding and design skills, equipping them for future opportunities in STEM and beyond.

Pastor Ellen's message that day, "The Holy Quad" builds from Proverbs 18.15, "An intelligent heart acquires knowledge, and the ear of the wise seeks knowledge," and John Wesley's teachings of the

Wesleyan Quadrilateral. The foundations of Wesleyan theology: Scripture, Tradition, Reason, and Experience.


November 23 concludes the Christian Year, but not the month.

UMCOR IN ACTION

UMCOR has been the recipient of our monthly coins on many occasions, as well as the focus of one of the special United Methodist Sundays each year. UMCOR is the United Methodist Committee on Relief and their work is vital and crucial. They are on the frontlines when there are natural disasters and public health emergencies. They support and protect immigrant families and provide food to displaced people. They bring hope to women who are survivors of violence. And the list goes on.

In 2024 Global Ministries and UMCOR:

- Distributed \$37.6 million in humanitarian relief
- Implemented 187 emergency and solidarity grants
- Assisted survivors of 137 global humanitarian crises, including 42 extreme weather events; 32 floods; 3 earthquakes; 7 public health emergencies; and 25 migration events

100% of funds contributed to UMCOR go directly to the programs they are intended for. Administrative costs and operational costs are covered by other funds.



Haiti Alive ~ Attracted to Hope



About the book:


Hope is a word we use often, but it's far more than a simple wish or passing desire. True hope runs deeper—it's something we can cultivate, plan for, and actively pursue.

The mission of the **Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation** is to **honor the sacrifice** of FDNY firefighter Stephen Siller—and all those who laid down their lives to save others on September 11, 2001. The foundation continues to honor our military members and first responders who still make the supreme sacrifice of life and limb for our country.

On that tragic morning, **Stephen Siller** had just finished his shift and was on his way to play golf with his brothers when he heard on his scanner that a plane had struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center. He drove to the entrance of the Brooklyn-Battery Tunnel, but it had already been closed for security reasons. Determined to do his duty, Stephen strapped **60 pounds of gear** to his back and ran on foot through the tunnel to the Twin Towers—where he gave his life while saving others.

Stephen left behind a wife and five children. He had grown up in a family of **lay Franciscans**, inspired by the words of St. Francis of Assisi:

"While we have time, let us do good."

Stephen's life and heroic death remind us to spend our time here on earth doing good.

This is his legacy.
