


October 2025 "Increase our faith!" ~ Luke 15.7 CEB


- Their full name

October is one of my favorite months for worship planning and designing experiences that remind us of the larger body of Christ—the global body of Christ. We begin and end with an ecumenical focus. World Communion Sunday celebrates the unity and diversity of the universal Christian community. As we gather around the Lord's table, we recognize our unity in Christ, joining with others worldwide in Holy Communion. We conclude the month honoring the Protestant Reformation (Martin Luther posting the 95 Theses.)

World Communion Sunday is one of

the Six Special Sundays of The United Methodist Church and embracing this commitment, United Methodists are dedicated to nurturing diverse leadership within the church by allocating funds for scholarships and leadership training for under-represented students. This is also the Sunday that we have chosen locally to celebrate, affirm, and support the Open Table community meal program. We will collect a special offering for this ministry. Will you help us reach our goal of \$1,250 for 2025-26?





The Oshkosh Back 2 School Fair held in August was a great success! This event is a passion of mine because every child deserves an equal opportunity to start the school year with confidence and enthusiasm. We provide families that do not have the financial means a venue to get a backpack, school supplies, clothing, shoes, hygiene items, haircuts and connections to community supports.

So....A BIG thank you to all of you who participated with a donation of children's clothing!

Pastor Ellen has been reminding us that each of us is capable of making a difference and that when we make connections and work cooperatively, we are able to multiply what we can do. This event is a perfect example of that.

One of you donated an outfit. Then another one, and another until we collected a shopping cart full of clothing. That cart was added to collections of clothing from 22 other churches and soon we had enough clothing to fill a room and provide an outfit for each of our students.

Add to this the work of over 20 committee members, 17 community organizations, 12 major funders/donors and over 50 volunteers, and the fair was able to provide for **1200 kids** during the two-day event and **300** more on the waiting list in the following weeks.

The BTSF truly demonstrates the impact of collaboration and the value of united efforts to shape educational outcomes and positively influence students' success and overall well-being. And personally, for me, ...seeing and "high fiving" the kids as they strut out, proudly sporting a full backpack and a huge smile is everything.

Haiti Alive ~ Attracted to Hope


